Families are valued here! Thank you for trusting us with your time and spiritual care. Kids activity sheets and crayons are available on tables as you enter worship.

Two family-friendly rooms are located to the left and right of the main level sanctuary. One room is exclusively for nursing moms while the other is available for families who might need a quieter environment or simply more space to move during worship.

HOLY COMMUNION

Today we celebrate the Lord's Supper as instituted by Jesus the night before He died. In keeping with 1 Corinthians 11:26-29, we ask everyone seeking communion to examine themselves by asking:

Am I sorry for my sins and desire forgiveness?

Do I believe that Jesus, by His death, offers me forgiveness?

Do I believe that I receive the true body and blood of Christ with the bread and wine?

Do I desire, with the help of the Holy Spirit, to turn from my sinful ways?

All who trust in these words of Christ, "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins," who share our confession of faith, and can answer "Yes!" to the questions above, are invited to join us in this celebration!

If you choose not to commune with us, we invite you and any children who have not yet received communion instruction to come forward to receive a blessing. To communicate that you want a blessing instead of communion, simply cross your arms when you come forward. For those who prefer, we offer grape juice and gluten-free wafers. Grape juice is in the center of the communion trays, and you can ask for a gluten-free wafer when you come forward.

Our worship assistants and ushers are available to bring communion to those unable to come to the rail. To indicate that you need this service, please speak to one of our team members with the blue-colored lanyards before communion, and they will make sure to bring it to you.

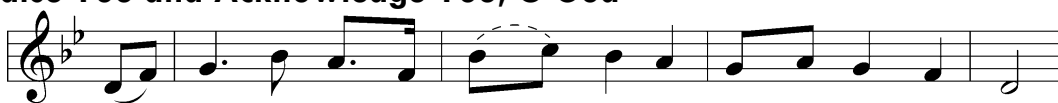

So then, they will be your judges. ²⁰ But if I drive out demons by the finger of God, then the kingdom of God has come upon you. ²¹ “When a strong man, fully armed, guards his own house, his possessions are safe. ²² But when someone stronger attacks and overpowers him, he takes away the armor in which the man trusted and divides up his plunder. ²³ “Whoever is not with me is against me, and whoever does not gather with me scatters.

²⁴ “When an impure spirit comes out of a person, it goes through arid places seeking rest and does not find it. Then it says, ‘I will return to the house I left.’ ²⁵ When it arrives, it finds the house swept clean and put in order. ²⁶ Then it goes and takes seven other spirits more wicked than itself, and they go in and live there. And the final condition of that person is worse than the first.” ²⁷ As Jesus was saying these things, a woman in the crowd called out, “Blessed is the mother who gave you birth and nursed you.” ²⁸ He replied, “Blessed rather are those who hear the word of God and obey it.”

BUILDING THE FUTURE: NEXT GEN MINISTRY

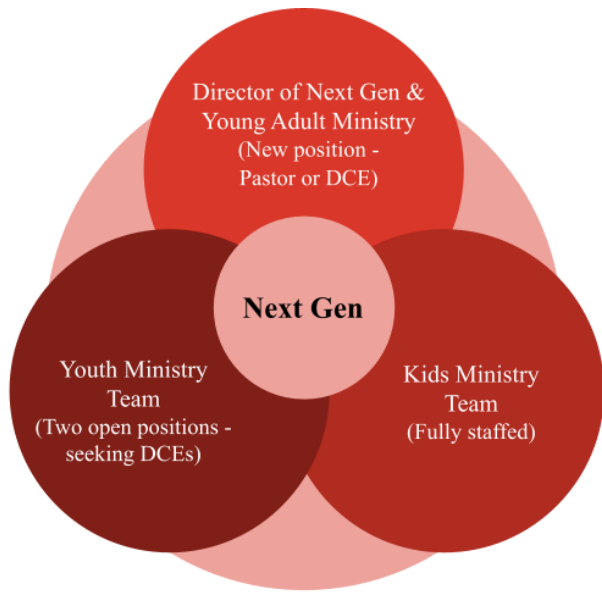
*"No one pours new wine into old wineskins. Otherwise, the new wine will burst the skins; the wine will run out, and the wineskins will be ruined. No, **new wine must be poured into new wineskins.**" — Luke 5:37–38*

Over the past few months, as we've been searching for our next youth leader, we've been keeping our vision in the forefront of all our work: "To effectively connect the next generation to Christ and lead them to lifelong discipleship" — Growing Young and Deeper in Christ.

New Next Gen Team: As we've continually sought the Lord in this process, it has become clear that He wants to do a new thing here at St. Peter's by creating a unified approach to reaching every stage of the next generation. **The Next Gen Team** brings together Kids Ministry (birth-6th grade), Youth Ministry (7th-12th grade), and Young Adult Ministry (18-25-year-olds) under one cohesive umbrella, creating intentional bridges across their critical seasons of spiritual development. In partnership with families and St. Peter's School staff, Next Gen will cultivate a culture where the next generation has a strong voice in shaping our ministry strategy, ensuring intentional discipleship at every stage of life that leads to lifelong followers of Jesus.

Two New Youth Ministers: Bethany Hayes, our Trek (Junior High) Specialist, has been called by the Lord to enter a new season. She will serve through May, when we'll celebrate what God is doing in her life. This opens up two positions, and we're taking a new approach. Instead of separating junior high and high school, we're calling two Directors of Christian Education (DCEs) to serve 7th-12th grade together, with roles determined by the Next Gen team. This strategic move positions us for greater impact and stewardship.

New Pastor to Lead Next Gen: The Next Gen Department will need a leader with theological depth and leadership skills to mentor staff, shape and champion young adult ministry (18-25-year-olds), teach across all age groups, and speak to our congregation. An ordained pastor will elevate the Next Generation's voice through sermons, devotions, and strategic leadership—ensuring this ministry shapes the future of our church and community.
