2. ASK AROUND.

TAKE YOUR TIME AND THOROUGH IN YOUR SEARCH. ASK FOR RECOMMENDATIONS FROM FRIENDS, NEIGHBORS, BUSINESS COLLEAGUES, LENDERS, SUPPLIERS AND SUBCONTRACTORS.

3. CHECK FOR PROPER PAPERWORK.

SOME STATES, NOT ALL STATES, REQUIRE CONTRACTORS TO BE LICENSED AND BONDED IN YOUR AREA. CHECK WITH LOCAL STATE OR COUNTY LICENSE AGENCIES TO ENSURE THE CONTRACTOR MEETS ALL REQUIREMENTS. YOU MAY ALSO ASK THE CONTRACTOR TO SEE THEIR CERTIFICATION OF INSURANCE AND CONFIRM THEY CARRY WORKERS COMPENSATION, PROPERTY DAMAGE AND PERSONAL LIABILITY INSURANCE.
