I'm making a way in the desert,



Live Green Lexington reports a record 2934 pounds of Christmas lights have been collected! That equals the weight of one hippo!



In **Fayette Alliance** news, Lexington ranks in the top 10 nationally for cities with the most green space. One hundred cities were ranked based on the number of parks, total acreage, and average yard size. Lexington ranked #2 for the highest total green area per capita! McConnell Springs, Raven Run Nature Sanctuary, and Hisle



Farm Park (for horseback riding) were highlighted in the survey by the Lawn Love company.

Mayor Gorton said in her State of the City address that the city will continue to prioritize investment in local parks. Already, \$25 million has been designated for the expansion and improvement of parks in Lexington — like the development of Cardinal Run North and the purchase of property along the Kentucky River. Overall, Louisville ranked #20, Cincinnati, #25. Woodland is blessed with our very own Woodland Park just across the street.

The PLASTIC BAG STORE is a custom-built, traveling public art installation and film experience designed to encourage visitors to think more about the "enduring impact of single-use plastics." (*Youngstown Vindicator*, 1/18/23) The store is set up like a real grocery store, except all items are made from single-use plastics taken from streets and garbage dumps! Creator and artist, Robin Frohardt is the driving force behind the store which features everything from meat and toiletries, to cakes, eggs and produce. Check it out on YouTube!
