2 Chronicles 14:2-4

²Asa did what was good and right in the eyes of the LORD his God. ³He removed the foreign altars and the high places, smashed the sacred stones and cut down the Asherah poles. ⁴He commanded Judah to seek the LORD, the God of their fathers, and to obey his laws and commands.

• Repentance precedes renewal.

2 Chronicles 14:11

See, I am sending you silver and gold. Now break your treaty with Baasha king of Israel so he will withdraw from me."

rely = shaan (shaw-an') = to lean upon, to trust for support

In the thirty-ninth year of his reign Asa was afflicted with a disease in his feet. Though his disease was severe, even in his illness he did not seek help from the LORD, but only from the physicians.

Our default mode is self-reliance.
