John 14:1-6

1 "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God; trust also in me. 2 In my Father's house are many rooms; if it were not so, I would have told you. I am going there to prepare a place for you. 3 And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am. 4 You know the way to the place where I am going."

ADVENT

History

Advent is to Christmas what Lent is to Easter. It's a period of preparation, anticipation, and expectation. It has a bi-directional element to it—we look back at Jesus' entry into humanity (incarnation) and we look ahead to his promised return. Looking back reminds us that God is faithful to deliver on His promises. Looking ahead reminds us that "current" is not eternal. The word "advent" comes from the Latin word adventus and means "arrival" or "coming." It spans the four-week period preceding December 25 and has four themes: HOPE, JOY, PEACE, LOVE.

Advent Wreath

The Advent wreath symbolizes the beginning of the church year. It is a circular evergreen wreath with five candles, four around the wreath and one in the center. The wreath's circle reminds us of God Himself, He is eternal, He has no beginning or end. The green speaks of the hope that we have in God, the hope of renewal, of healing, of redemption, of eternal life.

The four outer candles represent the waiting period—the four hundred years between the prophet Malachi and the birth of Christ (each outer candle represents 100 years).

The candlelight reminds us that Jesus is the Light of the World who comes into the darkness of our lives to bring newness, life. It also reminds us that we are called to be a light to the world as we reflect God's grace to others. The progressive candle lighting symbolizes our waiting experience. As the candles are lit over the four-week period, the darkness of fear and hopelessness recedes and the shadows of sin fall away as more and more light enters the world.

The center candle—the Christ Candle—is traditionally lit on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day. The central location of this candle reminds us that the incarnation is the heart of the season—the promise of long ago has been realized.

JOY (Nov. 28-Dec 4)

Reading: John 14:1-6

Candle: lighting of first advent candle, purple, called prophecy candle, represents royalty

HOPE (Dec 5-11)

Reading: John 1:1-5

Candle: lighting of second advent candle, purple, called the Bethlehem candle, represents royalty born in a manger

PEACE (Dec 12-18)

Reading: John 8:3-11

Candle: lighting of the third advent candle, purple, called angels candle, represents the birth announcement of a King

LOVE (Dec 19-24)

Reading: Matthew 1:18-23

Candle: lighting of the fourth advent candle, pink, called shepherds candle, represents God's love & faithfulness

Christmas Eve/Christmas Day:

Reading: John 14:27, 16:33

Candle: lighting the center white candle (Christ candle)

Goal: one meal/week where you gather the family, light candles, read Scripture...etc.
