Background on Corinth: "Las Vegas meets Miami"

- Population = 80,000
- What happens in Corinth stays in Corinth
- Sits on the SW corner of the isthmus and SE corner of the western gulf
- Massive hub for trade
- Had several freshwater springs that made the city a sought-after destination
- Excessively proud of its Romanitas (Roman-ness)
- Home of the temples to Aphrodite, Poseidon, Apollo, Asclepius
- Social imbalance = a few rich, many poor, at least half were slaves

A Plea for Unity

1 Corinthians 1:10-12

10 I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree with one another in what you say and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be perfectly united in mind and thought. 11 My brothers and sisters, some from Chloe's household have informed me that there are quarrels among you. 12 What I mean is this: One of you says, "I follow Paul"; another, "I follow Apollos"; another, "I follow Cephas"; still another, "I follow Christ."
