SUSTAINING OUR WORLD BY CELEBRATING IMPERFECTION!

Yes, right. Like "don't think of the color blue." We have become so accustomed to rejecting imperfection — from the produce we buy at the store to the penchant for needing "this year's" fashions. But what if we stopped focusing on what's "not right?" and celebrated Good Enough moments.

Our society constantly tells us we are not Good Enough, what if the church were to decide our message is you are Good Enough! If God can call you a Child of God, then that ought to be enough. What if our message to the community is you are welcome, you are loved, you are good enough? What if?

Some of us are perfectionists, slowly reforming our self-images, our very understanding of worth to a more health motto if even my imperfect is Good Enough. And I have found that embracing my good enough self takes some work, so willingness to let go of voices in my head that push me toward perfection and to be still with God and hear the voice that calls me beloved.

Marica McFee, the creator of the series Good Enough we are using in worship this Lent has some other ideas or suggestions to help us move toward embracing a less than perfect world. Here are two ideas that I have tried.

Food At the grocery store, we often try to select produce that is free from bruises, protrusions, or discoloration. Even before reaching the shelves, food goes through a rigorous inspection process that rejects specimens that have been deemed too "ugly" for display. This filtering process results in a huge amount of food being wasted because of aesthetics. But operations like Misfits Market and Imperfect Foods are working to change that.

Clothing There is a spectrum of sustainability when it comes to clothing. Some folks have a higher tolerance for worn and faded clothing or outdated fashion than others. Invite your congregation to think about how often they purchase new clothes, how long items stay in their possession, and what happens to clothes that are eventually purged from closets and drawers. It may be a meaningful challenge for some folks to not purchase any new clothes during Lent as a spiritual practice. Websites like Poshmark and ThredUP look to provide opportunities for online thrift shopping.

God keeps remining me that my less that perfect self is Good Enough. We are Good Enough!

YOUTH UPDATE

Blessings to all,

Hoping everyone is safe in this new freedom we are just restarting to enjoy. At this time we want to share with you some updates and other news for your youth and family. Triennium has been cancelled due to the pandemic. Here we share the official communication:

The Office of Presbyterian Youth and Triennium has come to the difficult but important decision to cancel the Presbyterian Youth Triennium 2022 in-person event.

In beginning to address the many COVID recommendations and requirements, our office and coordinators became increasingly concerned that we were no longer planning and hosting a youth gathering so much as coordinating a COVID-centered event. This, along with the news that we would face a 100% chance of clusters at our event, made it clear we needed to shift.

Instead of holding a traditional Triennium this summer, we are focused on launching PYT Beyond a new expanded ministry for Presbyterian youth that will offer virtual sessions, regional gatherings, and online courses related to the theme, "When Did We See You?"

We will have more updates as they share more information about the next steps with this new project.

Our community Easter Festival will be on Saturday April 16 from 9 to 11 am. We need volunteers, please sign up. It's a great time to spend family time together and meet our neighbors through this shared time with our community.

CALLING ALL INTERESTED STUDENTS

WHO: Marion County high school and college students aged 15-24 years?

WHAT: The policy taskforce of the Marion County Youth Violence Prevention Coalition (MCYVPC) is looking to fund eight students aged 15-24 years who have a passion for being involved in their community and in violence prevention initiatives. We want students who enjoy advocacy, education, and peer mentoring. \$500 stipends are available over the course of 5 months.

Action items include but are not limited to:

- * Attend coalition and policy task force meetings
- * Create educational opportunities for coalition members, partners, and peers around the legislative process, who our Indiana legislators are, bills relevant to violence prevention, and more.
- * Help connect peers to Indiana legislators,
- * Assist with and attend coalition-wide events

WHEN: April 2022 - August 2022 (5 month commitment)

WHY: Violence related injuries and deaths are on the rise and have many negative impacts on those involved, family members and our communities. The MCYVPC activates community partners to prevent youth violence. Six taskforces, one of which being the policy taskforce, exist to advocate for system-level change and support youth and their families. Youth involvement and leadership is a priority area of the coalition. We hope you will consider being a part of our team!
