THE ROLLER COASTER OF CHANGE

So, we made it through the storm, or so the song goes. We have made it through some significant changes within a truly short time. If you are feeling a bit tired or finding yourself wondering about where you fit, you are not alone. In less than two years, you have said goodbye to a pastor, an organist, a youth pastor, and the director of music; you have seen members come and go and witnessed some careful planning around the budget and the continual reminder that we are not what we used to be.

The Christian life is actually all about change. Abraham and Sarah were a well-established couple in their middle age (Abraham was 75 years old). They were settled into the community in Haran when Abraham had a dream from God, and all that changed. He loaded up his wife, Sarah, some servants (roughly 914 people) and livestock (primarily sheep), and his nephew Lot, with Lot's family, servants, and livestock, and began a journey of eight hundred miles. It was like moving to a small town. It must have been overwhelming, depressing, and disorientating for everyone.

I remember standing in the middle of boxes and stuff a couple days after my family and I moved to our home in Normal, IL. We had lived in the Northwest Suburbs of Chicago for 23 years, and we moved for me to take my first call to a church in Bloomington, IL. I stood in my new living room, and I remember thinking this was the worst idea I had ever had. I was overwhelmed, depressed, disoriented, and to be honest scared. Now 21 years later, I can report it was God's plan, and I am glad I went through that crazy roller coaster of change.

It took a lot of patience and trust for Abraham to lead this group of people, animals, and their belongings to a new location that God had promised. It has also taken a lot of patience and will take a lot of trust to elect a PNC in the next month or so and charge them to discern who your next pastor will be.

So if you feel a little unsure about this transitional time, I am sure that Abraham or perhaps Sarah would counsel us to wait and trust God to make things work. In the end, God is the author of this new relationship, and if we keep reminding ourselves that it is God's plan, not our plan, then we will be ready to greet the new pastor with open arms.

PALM SUNDAY – APRIL 2

Worship at 10 am Intergenerational and Adult Church School at 11 am

Celebration of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. We will also dedicate the One Great Hour of Sharing this day.

MAUNDY THURSDAY - APRIL 6

Worship Service at 7 pm

The service will include music, scripture, and the celebration of the Lord's Supper. Worshippers will have an opportunity to walk the Protestant Stations of the Cross.

The Stations of the Cross or the Way of the Cross, also known as the Way of Sorrows or the Via Crucis, refers to a series of images depicting Jesus Christ on the day of his crucifixion and accompanying scripture and prayers. The stations grew out of imitations of the Via Dolorosa in Jerusalem, which is a traditional processional route symbolizing the actual path Jesus walked to Mount Calvary. The objective of the stations is to help the Christian faithful to make a spiritual pilgrimage through contemplation of the Passion Story of Christ. It's one of the most popular devotions and the stations can be found in many Western Christian churches including Anglican, Lutheran, Methodist, and Roman Catholic
