In the early 1960's it became evident that there was a need for a Presbyterian church on the growing edge of Speedway and West Side of Indianapolis. Five acres was purchased, and an organizing pastor was selected. Over the 60 years of ministry John Knox has had four called and installed pastors. The words Open, Caring, Community have been used to describe the essence of John Knox. Open referring to the more than ten outside groups that use John Knox as their home. Even during Covid, JKPC has provided opportunities for the surround community to gather, including things like VBS. Underneath all of this activity is the care, and the acknowledgement that Christ as called be a neighbor to all.

We enter John Knox 60th year of ministry in transition. The church feels blessed to be mortgage free, with a beautiful space to worship God, we know that the future is still unfolding. On Sunday March 6th after each service there will be a time to celebrate the past and peak into the future as the congregation is looking forward clarifying what God might be planning for our future. OUR LENTEN THEME -GOOD ENOUGH

We live in a culture bent on definitions of a good life as continuous upward mobility-climbing ladders of prosperity with increasingly fabulous experiences that we can post to ever-more-likable social media accounts. We may comb the shelves of the self-help section in search of just the right formula to gain success. Perhaps we even gravitate towards spiritual leaders who promise great rewards if we only do "the right thing." But life happens, right? Most times we are not moving upward but trying to repair the rung we've just slipped from. So, what if we stopped climbing and started fertilizing, watering, and blooming right where we find ourselves? Welcome to a Lent of affirming a faith in which we are blessed, regardless, and where we can lean into embracing our "good enough" lives.

Join us as the Season of Lent begins March 2 with a 7 p.m. Ash Wednesday Service. We continue through the 40 days of Lent celebrating little Easters of Sunday. On April 10 we begin to look towards the cross as we journey with Jesus from the Palm Sunday high to a Maundy Thursday Last Supper at 7 p.m. Good Friday we return to our sanctuary at 7 p.m., joined by the Speedway ministerial Association as reflect on Christ last minutes on Earth. Saturday, we wait in anticipation of Christ Sunday Morning Easter Resurrection, worship with communion will be celebrated at both 9:00 am and 11:00 a.m.

MISSION WORK OF OUR PRESBYTERY

In December, the Hispanic Ministry Lead Team of our Presbytery, Whitewater Valley decided to send mission dollars to the southwestern region of the Dominican Republic (DR). In the past several years, our team had been able to travel to the Dominican Republic to connect and build relationships with the pastors and their congregations. I have shared about my relationship that has formed over the years with Pastor Elsa Thomas, her husband Jairo, their son, Eliseo and Elsa's congregations in Tamayo and Uvilla.

The HMLT decided that since we had not spent the money from our mission fund for travel expenses and supplies to go to the DR we could send the money to help support their ministry. It was approved by the team to send all twelve churches \$700 each. We urged them to use \$500 for outreach to the community to do God's work and \$200 would be given to the pastors to help supplement their incomes. In return, we have asked for stories of how the money has been spent.

Elsa has done amazing things with her \$500. She hired a man to fix the toilet in the church. She purchased medicine for two people suffering from thrombosis. She bought food for two families who have been out of work for months. She bought medicine for a member's daughter, who could not afford the medicine for herself. Her husband, Jairo bought a microphone and sound equipment for his new church building. This gift from our Presbytery was supported by mission dollars from various congregations including John Knox Presbyterian Church. I can't begin to tell you what this gift means to the people in the Dominican Republic, who have also struggled with Covid and don't have the extra resources to help recover when giving is low.

HMLT will be sending funds to support Vacation Bible School this summer since we will not be able to travel with supplies to this area. This is due to uncertainty of what Covid will do. Our team is hoping to go this fall, which I plan to join them. Thanks again for all your support!
