SEASON OF LENT -THEME - LISTEN

We once again will enter the Season of Lent at the end of February (Ash Wednesday is February 22) This year are theme is Listen. One of the ways you can intentionally listen is to Create a sacred worship space in your home. Then intentionally use the space for daily devotional time. Katie Bowler (who wrote last year's devotional Good Enough) has a new devotional Bless the Lent we Actually Have; and that will be available to pick up starting February 19th. Here are some ideas about creating a scared worship space.

Choose Your Location, where do you worship?

In deciding on the location for your sacred space, your Holy space, keep in mind your intention.

Will you use this space daily or weekly? Do you have room on your coffee table or a breakfast nook in the kitchen? Would a small corner of a shelf or table in the living room or den work? Do you already have a place in your home where you feel comfortable, relaxed, at peace?

NOW - Be Creative.

The beauty of creating your sacred space is that it is a completely inspirational process with no rules or restrictions. The Space is your vision, so enjoy making it personal.

Choose Meaningful Items.

Include items that evoke feelings of calm and of peace, and items that remind you of God, Son, and Spirit. Try to involve your senses. Here are some suggestions:

- A cross
- A candle to remind you Jesus is the light of the world (you can use the small candle from the Advent wreath if you want)
- A plant, flowers, a rock, or seashell something from nature to remind you God is the Creator
- Incense, a candle or essential oils to create a sensory experience with smell
- Fabric to create an altar space to reflect the various seasons of the year
- Pictures of family or friends, some type of heirloom or memento

Using the Space.

Once you have created your sacred space, consider how you will approach the space when you use it: **Be intentional.**

Just as you would enter the sanctuary, enter your sacred space with a mindset of worship and prayer, and a desire to remove all distractions and concerns from your mind. Be intentional about not having your phone with you or near you.

If you enjoy reflecting through writing or drawing, you could add a journal, notepaper, writing utensils, and some of your artwork to your sacred space.

If you are musical, you may want to include a hymnal or speaker to play special hymns or worship music that speaks to you.

If you are unable to designate a space on a permanent or semipermanent basis, consider placing the items in a basket or box where they can be housed in between your worship times.

IF you have younger family members worship with you.

If your space is to be shared with members of your family, include them in the planning.

Have them contribute special objects to the sacred space. What would make your space feel sacred to your family? Have children's Bibles in addition to your own Bible.

Consider having a large blanket the entire family could sit on during worship.

Say family prayers, read Bible stories, make time to journal, draw, reflect, and just quietly pray and listen. Remind everyone how often Jesus went away by himself to pray and be quiet.

A Blessing for Your Home.

Take the time to dedicate your sacred space for the purpose it will be used. Here is a blessing you might use on your own or with your family:

God, we know this is holy space.
May your Spirit fill this home with your holy mystery.
May this home be a place of sacred connection to you, Lord.
Amen.

COME SEE WHAT WE ARE GROWING HERE Transition Team Mission Study Update

In January, following the Annual Congregational Meeting, the Transition Team hosted a chili lunch and then presented a summary of the Mission Study groups' discussions. Our future story, Come See What We Are Growing Here, highlighted themes that the groups were passionate about including the Storehouse, VBS, Soccer camp, fellowship, and what we do best...EATING!!

The next phase of the Mission study is to test the future story with a few small, short-term projects. The first is a Pancake breakfast on March 11 that will be advertised to the families served by The Storehouse in the weeks prior to the breakfast. Volunteers are needed for set up the night before, and to help in the kitchen, to greet and serve our guests and then to clean up after the breakfast. The time commitment is minimal. Training will be provided. Signup sheets and job descriptions are available in the main hallway on the Storehouse table after the service on Sundays. Questions? Ask one of the Transition team who will be close by the table.

The second project will kick off this spring. Behind The Storehouse are garden plots that we have permission to plant. By growing fresh vegetables, we can supplement the food panty and provide fresh produce to the families served each month. Look for more details in future issues of the Tidings.

The Transition Team presentation was recorded and will be made available as soon as the editing is complete. Electronic copies of the congregational assessment done by our Mission Study consultant New Beginnings and copies of the future story can be requested by contacting the church office, Pastor Beth or any member of the Transition Team. New Beginnings will continue to coach the Transition team through the two projects.
