Have hands and feet? Love to support learning and growth? Have a passion for people? You are a perfect Liberty Kids Volunteer! Liberty Kids 1 (six months to 2.5 years old) meets from 10:45 through the end of the service. Liberty Kids 2 (2.5 years old to Pre-K), Liberty Kids 3 (Kindergarten to second grade) and Liberty Kids 4 (third to fifth grade) only meet during the sermon portion of the service. For Liberty Kids 1 all you need to do is show up! For Liberty Kids 2 through 4 you'll check in with the lead teacher(s) for that week to make sure everything is set, then support them with the lesson and activities.

LIBERTI YOUTH

Volunteer

Working with Liberty Youth is a great opportunity for anyone who enjoys working with teenagers. Our regular meetings are once/week (Sunday evenings this year) with one event per month (usually on Saturdays) between September and May, plus two annual volunteer meetings (May/June and August). This year we are discussing our Practices of Presence (aka Christian disciplines), such as Gospel Community, Sabbath, Corporate Worship, Fasting/Feasting, etc, as well as spending a month each discussing Advent and Lent. We take turns teaching lessons (one volunteer takes a full month) and organizing games (one volunteer leads games for a full month), though not everyone does both. The most important quality we are looking for is someone who is as comfortable playing a ridiculous game as they are having a serious theological discussion.

WORSHIP

Liturgy

The liturgist plays a crucial role in helping to lead the congregation through some elements of the service.
