**GLOBAL SHARPENING** 

Use a light touch with Global Sharpening



GET STARTED O WORK IN RAW	
GET THE IMAGE READY	
CROP THE IMAGE Use cropping to establish composition	
NOISE REDUCTION Check for Chromatic Noise and Luminance Noise	
WORK THE DETAILS	
GLOBAL EXPOSURE ADJUSTMENT Use the individual adjustments of: Highlights, Shadows, Whites, and Blacks	
CLIPPING – BLACK POINT  Set your Black Point so that just a tiny bit of the Clipping Indicator shows up in a non-important location of the image	
CLIPPING - WHITE POINT  Set your White Point so that just a tiny bit of the Clipping Indicator shows up in a non-important location of the image	
₩ GET THE COLOR RIGHT	
COLOR TEMPERATURE & COLOR TINT  Use the White Balance Tool to set Color Temperature & Tint, or use a visual check if doing special color effects	
CLARITY ADJUSTMENT Use Clarity to improve the "effective sharpness" of the image, and watch the Histogram so that you don't go too far	
SATURATION ADJUSTMENT All digital images can be improved with slight saturation adjustments- resist the temptation to go too far	
OPTIONAL: APPLY THE DEHAZE FUNCTION / APPLY A VIGNETTE	
FINAL DETAILS	
LOCALIZED EXPOSURE & SHARPENING  Use the Adjustment Brush in Photoshop and Lightroom. Use the Smart Brush Tool in Elements
