GET STARTED O WORK IN RAW
<b>♥ CHOOSE YOUR SUBJECT.</b>
It may be indoors or outdoors. If outside, bring materials to help make you more comfortable shooting at ground level.
O If you are outside, consider how the wind will affect your setup and camera settings.
O If using cut flowers, be sure to keep them fresh in water.
<b>♡ CONSIDER YOUR LIGHT.</b>
Are you using natural light or artificial light?
O If you are using a flash, where will you set up to make the most of the light?
PROVIDE STABILITY FOR YOUR CAMERA.
Use a tripod or stable surface to avoid camera shake.
<b>♡ CHECK YOUR BACKGROUND.</b>
Are there any distractions? Is the color of your background good for showcasing your subject?
○ Will you use one of your ready-made backgrounds?
SET YOUR WHITE BALANCE FOR PROPER COLOR.
<b>♡ COMPOSE YOUR SHOT.</b>
Consider the position of your subject within the frame, leading lines, patterns, texture, tones, etc.
Are you going to use a wide or narrow depth of field?
Oconsider how your plane of focus will affect composition.

<b>☆ TAKE A TEST SHOT.</b>
Check for proper exposure using the histogram.
MAKE ANY NECESSARY ADJUSTMENTS TO SHUTTER SPEED, ISO, OR APERTURE.
The state of the image that need more light or less light?
Use a scrim to soften light, or a reflector to bounce light where needed.
TAKE YOUR FINAL IMAGE AND EDIT IT USING POST-PROCESSING SOFTWARE.
Adjust white balance, tone, black and white values, and saturation/vibrance.
Make specific edits using the Heal Tool and Radial Filter.
₩ PRINT YOUR IMAGE.
Ensure that your monitor is calibrated to get true colors when printing.
O Consider the size of print and PPI so that you get the best resolution for your image.
