Assembly OKs bill ensuring bigotry free civil awards

CAOC-backed SB 41 seeks to overcome cynical efforts to diminish awards to women and minorities in personal injury and wrongful death cases

SACRAMENTO (July 1, 2019) – A bill that will ensure women and minorities are not deprived of fair compensation in civil cases by preventing the use of racially biased data in setting damage awards won final approval today in the California Assembly.

Senate Bill 41 by Sen. Bob Hertzberg (D-Van Nuys) and backed by Consumer Attorneys of California was approved on a 78-0 vote and now goes back to the state Senate for a final concurrence vote that would send it to the desk of Gov. Gavin Newsom.

The measure was spurred by the disturbing practice of defense attorneys in civil cases citing racial- and gender-biased data to limit a defendant's financial exposure in personal injury and wrongful death cases. The use of biased statistical tables to calculate civil damages is a standard practice across the country, including California.

“It's time to put an end to a practice that cynical, bigoted and unjust,” said Mike Arias, CAOC president. “Civil rights laws prohibit discrimination in a variety of areas, but no state or federal law prohibits the use of race, gender, religion, or sexual orientation in the calculation of damages awarded to injured parties.”

The result, Arias said, has been severe and unaddressed discrimination in court-awarded damages for certain protected classes. This practice deprives some individuals of fair compensation and perpetuates systemic inequality.

SB 41 remedies this injustice by prohibiting judges, juries and expert witnesses from considering a plaintiff's race, gender, religion or sexual orientation in calculating civil damage awards.
