CTLA's Employment Law Committee Chair, Clayton Wire, along with employment lawyers Laura Wolf, Hunter Swain, and Christine Breen, will conduct a panel discussion on many of the issues that employment lawyers will see in the coming years as we face the dystopian future, including: ADA Reasonable Accommodations and remote work; Whistleblower claims regarding Stimulus Funds and Medical Care; Expanded Workplace Safety Protection and Retaliation Claims; Expansion of Workers Compensation Claims; Privacy claims relating to remote workplace monitoring; Difficulties suing hospitals and medical offices; Enduring Changes to State and Federal DOL Rules; Wage & Hour claims relating to remote work; and Shifts in Anti-Discrimination Protections as result of viral transmission concerns.
