The Dallas Bar Association is launching an “Entrepreneurs in Community Lawyering” Program in 2019 as the first local legal incubator program in Dallas. Through the Entrepreneurs in Community Lawyering program the DBA seeks to create a pipeline of socially conscious lawyers that are well equipped to launch a financially sustainable solo or small firm practice that caters to a lower income clientele.

## WHY IS THE PROGRAM NEEDED?

- When faced with legal issues such as wrongful foreclosure, child custody, domestic violence and bankruptcy, many moderate-income Americans are deprived access to justice because they cannot find an affordable lawyer.

In Dallas:

- 28.8% of families with children in Dallas live below the poverty level
- 54.2% of Dallas households make less than \$50,000 a year
- At the same time, there are socially conscious law school graduates who would like to address the needs of this community but lack the practical legal and business skills necessary to launch and sustain a financially viable solo or small firm practice serving a modest means clientele.

## WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

- Recent law school graduates licensed less than 5 years with a strong interest in starting a solo or small firm practice serving a modest-means clientele
- All participants must complete an application and interview process and be invited to participate




## PARTICIPANTS RECEIVE:

## DBA INCUBATOR PROJECT (ENTREPRENEURS IN COMMUNITY LAWYERING)

The Dallas Bar Association's "Entrepreneurs in Community Lawyering" Program seeks to create a pipeline of socially conscious lawyers that are well equipped to launch a financially sustainable solo or small firm practice that caters to a lower income clientele. The following items are required to apply for the DBA Incubator Program. **Deadline to apply is Friday, June 21, 2019.**

- Application
- Résumé
- Statement of Intent (three page)
- Interview (if selected)

### **INTERVIEW**

If your application is selected for consideration, you will be contacted by the Dallas Bar Association to set up a phone interview. If you are selected to move forward to the second round of interviews, you will participate in a panel interview. You should anticipate being asked detailed questions about your business plan and other materials.

### **HOW WILL THE PROGRAM WORK?**

#### **Program Dates**

September 2019 - August 2020

#### **Training, Supervision and Mentoring**

The program will start with an initial multi-day boot camp training program that introduces participants to the incubator program and covers topics ranging from creating a business plan, setting up and operating a business, budgeting, marketing and business development, alternative fee structures and billing, and identifying areas of practice. Following the initial multi-day training, program participants will meet regularly over the course of 12 months with instructors who will provide in-depth guidance, assistance and training on substantive law, case management, professional responsibility and operating a business. Volunteer attorney mentors will also be made available to the participants.

#### **Pro Bono**

Incorporated into the program is mandatory pro bono requirement. Program participants will be encouraged to attend Dallas Volunteer Attorney Program (DVAP) training programs and fulfill a requisite number of pro bono hours through DVAP or another approved pro bono entity.

## **Resource Access**

Participants will be strongly encouraged to become active in the DBA and take advantage of its benefits. Through the DBA, participants will have access to free CLE, the Lawyer Referral Service, networking opportunities and training programs geared toward beginning lawyers such as Transition to Law and Trial Skills Academy.

## **WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?**

Recent law school graduates licensed less than 5 years with a strong interest in starting a solo or small firm practice serving a modest-means clientele. All participants must complete an application and interview process and be invited to participate. Participants must demonstrate determination, an entrepreneurial spirit, dedication to providing access to justice, and a firm commitment to the program. Sustainability of the applicant's proposed practice area is also critical. It is anticipated that the program will have eight to ten lawyers per session.

## **FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS**

### 1. What is the duration of the program?

The program is structured to last twelve months.

### 2. Do I need malpractice insurance?

Yes. Participants will be required to obtain insurance. The Dallas Bar Association can assist with helping you obtain affordable coverage.

### 3. Do I need to form my own firm?

Yes. You must either form your own solo firm or create/join one with other attorneys at the beginning of the program. Participants are not employees of Dallas Bar Association or the Dallas Volunteer Attorney Program. In consulting with Dallas Bar Association staff or other incubator participants, you will be expected to maintain client confidentiality consistent with participants' status as separate firms.

### 4. What are the expectations of me as a participant?

Aside from complying with your ethical obligations as a lawyer, you are expected to participate in the monthly CLE programs, schedule regular meetings with your mentor and contribute at least 200 hours of pro bono service during your time with the incubator.

### 5. What are the benefits of participating in the Incubator Program?

As a participant in the incubator program, you will receive concentrated training on establishing a successful practice, on-going supervision by dedicated solo/small firm practitioner, additional mentoring by lawyers in successful specialized practice, access to a supportive network of practitioners and many networking/business development opportunities.
