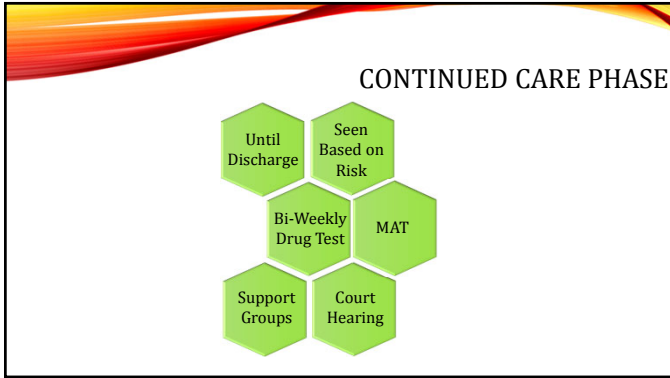
- 58 % had been in Marion County Jail prior to their death

 - 66 had been in the jail 30 days prior to their death

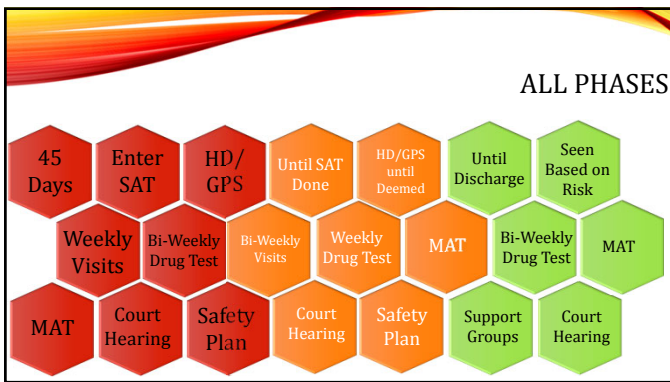








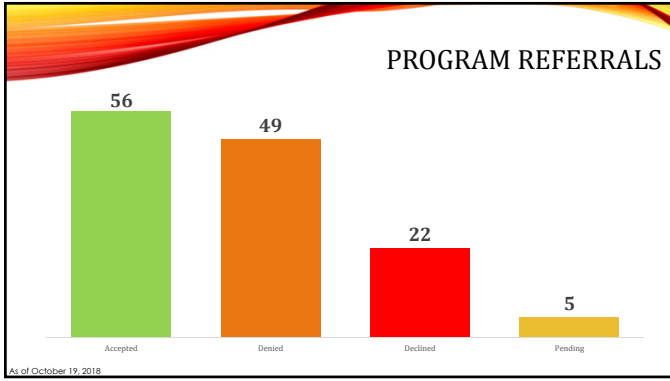


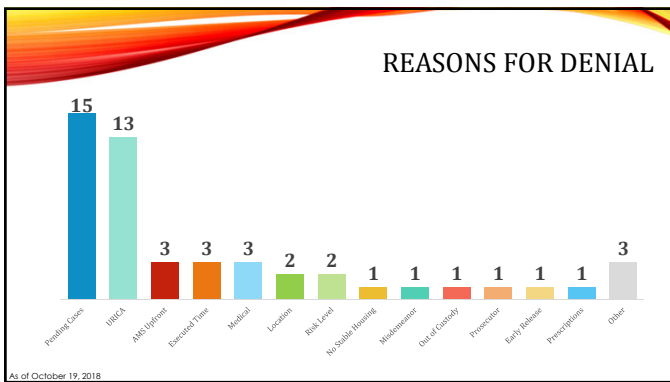


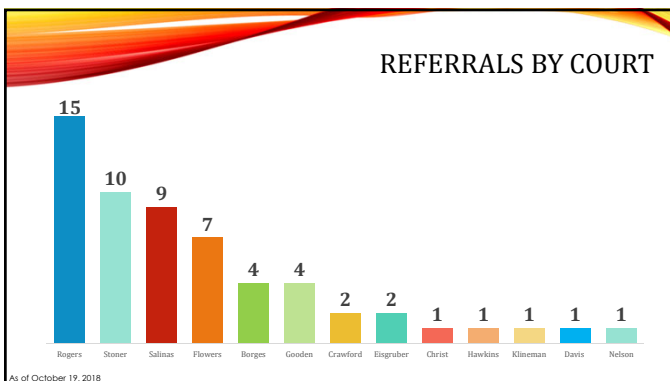

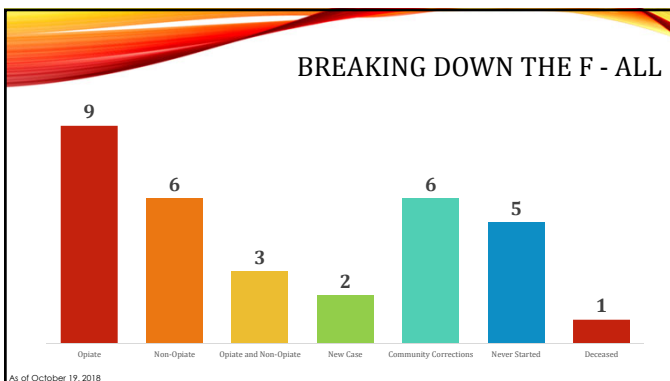
- All sanctions are presumptive and may be modified based on individual circumstances and the client's overall performance in the project.

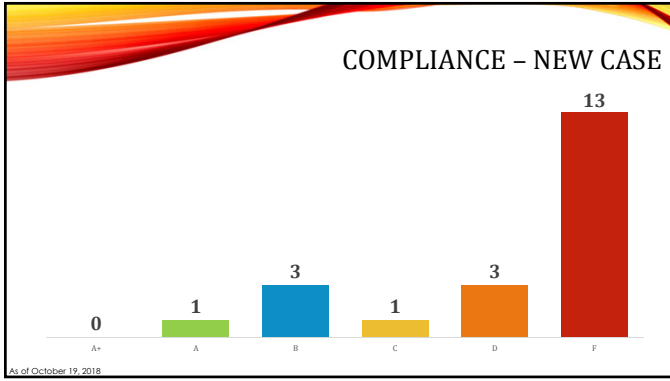


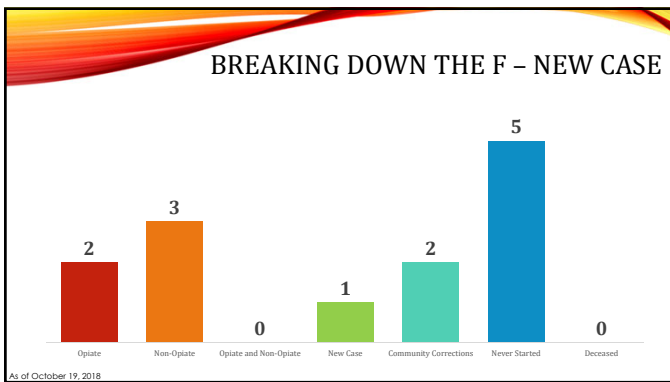


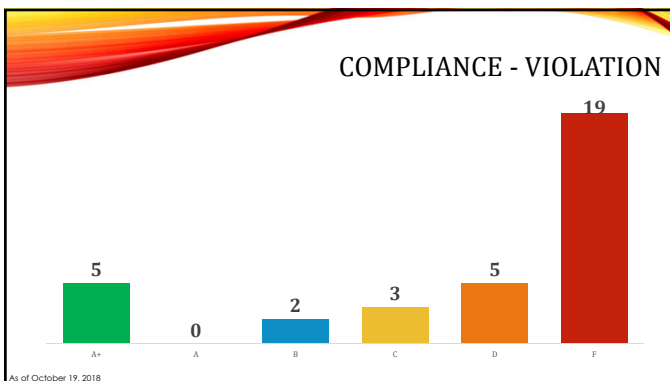


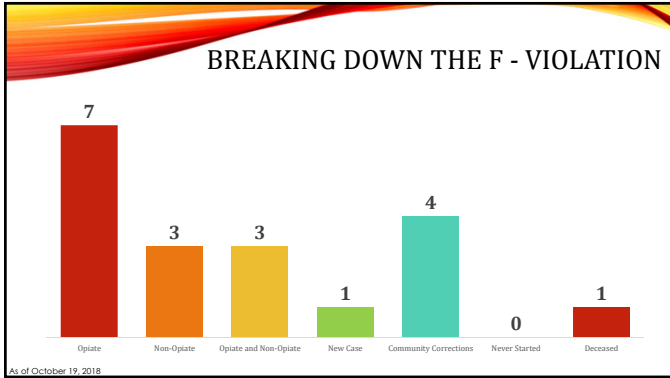


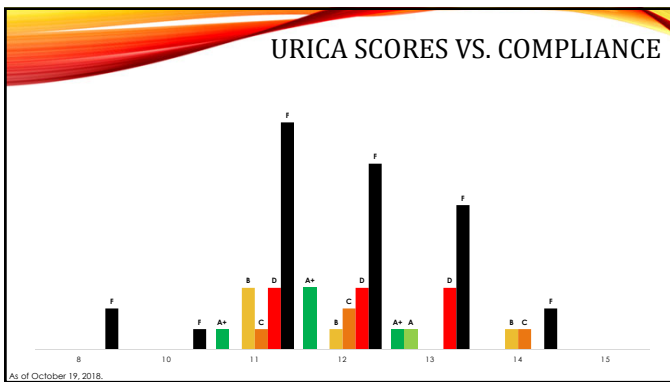












- ### LESSONS LEARNED
- Home Detention is a Pain
 - Home Detention is a Blessing
 - Relationship with Treatment Agency is crucial
 - Insurance issues are critical from the very first day
 - Housing issues need to be addressed prior to release
 - The client's Criminal History is important
 - Open Warrants
 - Failed PSC attempts
 - Home Visits are important, searches are even more important
 - Flexibility is a necessity
 - URICA is a good tool, but you have to assess beyond that
 - Busy Clients = Better Results
 - Utilize GPS Information (420)
 - Take Pictures at Graduation
