Kentucky Justice Association Announces Free Legal Assistance Program for State Disaster Victims

Louisville – The Kentucky Justice Association (KJA), the state’s professional organization of trial attorneys, announced today the beginning of a program offering free legal assistance to victims of the recent storms and flooding.

The program, known as the KJA Volunteer Disaster Legal Services Program, offers a variety of legal services and advice to storm and flood victims at no charge. The services offered include:

- Assistance with insurance claims (life, medical, property, etc.),
- Counsel on landlord-tenant and other housing problems,
- Assistance with home repair contracts,
- Assistance in consumer protection matters, remedies and procedures,
- Counsel on mortgage foreclosure problems,
- Replacement of important legal documents destroyed in a major disaster, and
- Assistance in connecting individuals to local or state agencies that might be of further assistance.

The services are provided free of charge, and should a potential case arise requiring paid legal representation, KJA will assist the victim in locating an attorney outside of the volunteer program.
