

MEMORIAL RESOLUTION FOR
DONALD GREGORY

1931-1997

Donald Gregory was a native of Shelbyville, Tennessee, where he was born in 1931, to the parents of Raymond and Gertrude Gregory. He resided in Davidson County until his death on June 14, 1997.

Don earned a Bachelor's Degree in journalism in 1953 from the University of Tennessee. While at the University he was a member of the Kappa Sigma fraternity.

After graduation from college, Don joined the United States Army where he was assigned to the Press Corps. He was stationed in Washington, D.C. On his release from the United States Army, Don became a correspondent for the Associated Press in Europe, Germany, France and Spain.

When Don returned to Tennessee, he was employed by WSM-Channel 4 television in Davidson County. He was News Director in the early 1960s. He changed careers, becoming the Press Secretary for United States Senator Robert Bass in 1964. In 1965, he became the Administrative Assistant for Congressman Richard Fulton.

In 1976, Don graduated from the Nashville School of Law. He began the private practice of law. Don specialized in criminal defense.

Don was a member of the Nashville Bar Association, the Tennessee Bar Association, and the Tennessee Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers. Don enjoyed the practice of law.

WHEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Nashville Bar Association that in the life of Donald Gregory, as a member of the Nashville Bar, we and the City of Nashville generally have
