

MEMORIAL RESOLUTION

HONORABLE DAVID J. LEVINE

The Nashville Bar Association mourns the passing of one of its members, David J. Levine, more commonly known as "Doc" Levine. Doc's life was filled with touching the lives of others, and it is only fitting that we mourn his loss.

Doc Levine was the son of Mary and Hayam Levine, born in Nashville, Tennessee on February 12, 1919. He grew up in Nashville where he obtained his education at old Tarbox school, graduated from Hume Fogg High School, graduated from Peabody College, attended Vanderbilt University, and finally graduating and obtaining his J.D. from the Nashville School of Law, formerly the Y.M.C.A. Night Law School, in 1971.

He began his professional teaching career at the old Central High School here in Nashville in 1941, and later, while teaching at Central High School, was promoted to Assistant Principal. He moved to Waverly Belmont Junior High School as Principal, and was there until his retirement. It was during his term as Principal of Waverly Belmont Junior High School he commenced his legal studies, attending the Y.M.C.A. Night Law School and graduating first in his class in 1971. After passing his Bar examination, he retired as Principal of Waverly Belmont Junior High School and commenced the practice of law with his brother, Morris Levine, with whom Doc practiced until he passed away August 11, 1994.

Doc became Dean of Students at the Nashville School of Law in 1976 and served in that capacity until his death.

He was the past Religious School Director at West End Synagogue where he taught Hebrew.


He was a member of the Nashville Bar Association, a charter member of the Metropolitan Nashville Education Association, and a Mason raised in Cumberland Lodge.


It has often been said that the monument to man can be seen in the number of lives he has touched, and in that respect, the monument to Doc Levine is so large as to be unmeasurable.
