When John Harrison Lowe left this life on March 4, 2018 he left an enduring imprint and legacy on his family, friends and colleagues and all who knew him well. A lot of things were important to John, but those who knew him remember him first and foremost as a devoted husband and father. John loved and cherished his family: his wife Nancy, his children and their spouses, Stephanie and Richard Bratcher, Justin and Kirsten Lowe and Courtney and Joseph Mankin as well as his grandchildren, Bailey Bratcher, Shelby Bratcher, Luke Bratcher, Brenton Lowe, Adelynn Lowe, Noland Mankin, and Corlee Mankin.

John was proud of his past. John grew up in East Nashville. He attended the Eleventh Street Church of Christ. He graduated from Isaac Litton High School in 1964, Middle TN State University in 1968 and went on to earn his Juris Doctorate degree from the Nashville School of Law. In addition, John was also a veteran of the U.S. Army. He served as a first lieutenant in the 291st military police.

In 1978 John created his own law firm which was located in Goodlettsville, TN. He was a student of the law and throughout his career kept current on updated code sections and new case law. John always took the time to be well prepared and always did his best for his clients. John often said that when he took your case it became his job to worry about your outcome.

John also served as the City Judge of Millersville, TN from 1981 up until the time of his passing. John possessed an excellent demeanor for being a Judge. Most of the cases involved

traffic infractions. When John presided over the Court he had a tradition of dismissing the case of the last person to be called on the docket. He felt if the person had to wait a couple of hours for their case to be called that was punishment enough.

John loved sports. He coached his children's softball and baseball teams. John always made it a priority to attend all his children's' sporting events. He would often leave the office in the middle of the afternoon to attend a softball or baseball game, only to come back after the game was over to prepare for the next day's work.

John had his own sense of old school style. He always had on a suit and a white shirt. His shoes were always shined. In addition, he always had his signature thick but well-groomed mustache and for many many years he always drove a late model Chevrolet Corvette.

John Lowe was a good and honorable Christian man. He was a devoted husband and he loved, cared for and cherished his children and grandchildren.


THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that we honor the life, work and legacy of our colleague,


