RESOLUTION IN MEMORY OF ISADORE R. SCHULMAN

Isadore R. Schulman - a name that evokes, among those who knew him, the image of an elder statesman with the knowledge and wisdom acquired through five decades of service at the Bar.

Known to those in the legal community as Isadore, I. R., Izzy or Mr. Schulman, he was known for his keen intellect, his thorough examination of the case, and his uncanny ability to perceive the central and most crucial issue.

Mr. Schulman had a fifty-seven year love affair with the law. His life was consumed with his dedication to the law, his practice, his law partners, associates and colleagues within the profession. He became renowned as the dean of real estate attorneys within this community, yet despite his prominence, he was never too busy nor was anyone more important than the person with the legal problem he was helping. Those within and without the legal profession knew that his counsel, advice, and his ear were but a phone call or a visit away.

Although Mr. Schulman devoted his life to his profession, he recognized that there were matters of equal importance outside the practice of law that were worthy of his attention and concern. Accordingly, he supported The Temple, Vanderbilt University, and various charitable organizations which he felt were not only worthwhile, but necessary for a better community in which to live.


Despite his demanding schedule of professional and civic responsibilities over the years, Mr. Schulman never forsook his familial obligations, being a concerned husband, brother and grandfather whose family loved him because he took the time to share their joys and sorrows, and he did leave a lasting impression upon them.
