Robert (Bob) D. Travis, age 63, of Lebanon, TN, passed away on May 1, 2017. Bob leaves behind, his loving wife of 25 years, Lisa Salyer Travis. He was the son of the late James R. (Jim) and Virginia Kennedy Travis. Bob is survived by his brother Pastor Buddy Travis & wife Pat of Dresden, TN, and sister, Jane Travis Cross & her husband, John of Olney, IL, along with his mother-in-law Louise Salyer & father-in-law Harold Salyer, of Nickelsville & Harrisonburg, VA. In addition to his legal practice, he was a licensed motor vehicle dealer and owned Travis Company which sold vehicles and farm equipment. For many years he engaged in the breeding and racing of Standardbred trotting horses throughout several states.

Bob Travis loved the adventure of traveling with Lisa, working on their farm and going to auctions. Another great passion was to provide a home for unwanted and neglected animals.
