

**MEMORIAL RESOLUTION
FOR
KARL P. WARDEN**

Karl P. Warden died March 17, 2008, at age 77. He is missed by his friends in the Nashville Bar, especially those who enrolled in his classes when he was Professor of Law at Vanderbilt University Law School (1968 until 1980).

Born in Fayetteville, West Virginia, Karl received his J.D. from West Virginia University Law School and his LL.M. from the University of Michigan Law School. He was admitted to practice both in West Virginia and Tennessee.

Professor Warden traveled far and wide during his career. He was on the faculties of Denver School of Law, Vanderbilt Law School, University of North Dakota School of Law (both Dean and Professor), and Mercer University Law School (also both Dean and Professor). Karl also served as a visiting Professor of Law at Kansas, Indiana, Florida, Louisiana State University, Tennessee, University of Papua, New Guinea, Cambridge University in England, and Modern University for the Humanities in Moscow, Russia.

Professor Warden was a noted expert in the fields of Criminal Law and Criminal Procedure. His students praised his creativity in the classroom, along with his sterling sense of drama and humor. His awards and honors include W.W. Cook Fellow, University of Michigan, and Outstanding Professor Awards at Denver, Mercer, and Vanderbilt.


As for his colleagues at Vanderbilt Law School, he will long be remembered as talented, upbeat, insightful, and energizing. His eclectic career included membership in the Central Model Railroad Club and, while at Vanderbilt, a member of the student-faculty band known as "The Statutory Grapes."


