MEMORIAL RESOLUTION

REUBEN HALE BRAZZELL

Reuben H. Brazzell died on April 28, 1975 in Nashville, Tennessee, at the age of 81. He was a native of Sumner County, Tennessee, having been born in that County near Gallatin on June 24, 1893. He was the son of Henry Truitt and Dolly Barber Brazzell. He was married first to Stella McGinnis in Mitchellville, Tennessee, on October 20, 1917, who died on March 21, 1949. There were two children born of this marriage; Harry McGinnis Brazzell and Corynne Elizabeth Arney.

He was married to Mrs. Noah Lemmonds on September 19, 1953, in Atlanta, Georgia, who survives. He is also survived by his two children; Dr. Harry McGinnis Brazzell and Corynne Elizabeth Arney and five grandchildren.

He was educated in the public schools of Sumner and Davidson County and Watkins Institute and received his High School Diploma from Caldwell School. He received his law degree from the YMCA Night Law School in 1937.

Mr. Brazzell practiced law in Nashville until 1942 when he was employed by the U. S. Government as a member of the War Labor Board with offices in Atlanta, Georgia. After World War II he returned to Nashville and resumed the private practice of law, specializing in labor and workmen's compensation law as he had previous to his service with the War Labor Board.

Mr. Brazzell was recognized as an outstanding Attorney in his specialized fields and many other Attorneys sought his advice and counsel on these phases of the law.

He retired from the practice of law in September, 1971 because of ill health.

He was a member of the West End Church of Christ and the independent Order of Odd Fellows.
