

## MEMORIAL RESOLUTION

FOR

KENNETH M. JACKSON

Some lawyers are noted litigators, some are skilled drafters, but the lawyer that is to be envied is the attorney that balances interesting legal work and a life well lived. You might call them renaissance attorneys. Ken Jackson was such a lawyer.

Kenneth Monroe Jackson, passed away in May of 2018. He was 81 years old when he died. Ken was born in 1936 in Kennedy, Texas and grew up in San Antonio. He attended Southern Methodist University from which he received his law degree. His legal career took him to Washington D.C. where he met Judy Jackson on a blind date. They were married in 1967 and celebrated 50 years together before Ken passed away.

Ken's practice took him to Massachusetts, then to Barrington, Illinois where he negotiated contracts for airborne cameras. Ken served as the president of National Contract Management Association. In 1990 he was offered a position with Textron Aerostructures in Nashville and he and his family moved to Tennessee.

But Ken was not satisfied just practicing law. Ken had an avid interest in model trains and found a love of acting. Over the last 27 years here in Nashville, Ken excelled in live theater, short films and industrial commercials. Some notable roles he performed were in, *Titus Andronicus*, *All My Sons*, *A Lie of the Mind*, *Tuesday's With Morrie*, and *The Crucible*. Ken gave an award-winning performance in *Camping with Henry and Tom*.

Ken was never content to do the same thing over and over. When he was 70, Ken developed an interest in theology and religion and returned to school, this time divinity school. In 2007 he received a Master of Divinity from Vanderbilt University. He would go on to teach at Glendale United Methodist and Good Shepard United Methodist Churches.


His divinity degree stood him well to be an effective mediator - which he continued to do up to a week before he passed away.

Ken was a cook, an open friend and a prolific reader. He was enamored of comedies on television such as Pink Panther, and Road Runner. He could often be found glued to Dancing with the Stars, the Voice and American Idol, - and football.


