CHARLES FRANK FRAZIER**

**1922-1997**

Charles Frank Frazier was born in 1922. He married Thelma R. Frazier. They resided in Davidson County where he died on January 16, 1997. They had five children, a son, George Frazier, and four daughters, Pamela Adkinson, Patricia Skrivanek, Cindy Axford, and Leigh Ann Hobbs. Charlie has ten grandchildren.

Charlie practiced general law in Davidson County. He loved the practice of law because he loved people. Charlie never met a stranger nor was he ever unwilling to help a person in need. His legal work helped acquire property for Berry Field, Nashville's first major airport. Charlie was a good mentor to lawyers coming to the Bar. He was a noted storyteller, spellbinding many a member of the Bar before Court.

In addition to his legal practice, Charlie was interested in politics. He served as Legal Counsel to the Davidson County Delegation of the Tennessee General Assembly from 1959 through 1962. In 1962, he ran as a Representative to the Tennessee House of Representatives.

During World War II, Charlie served in the United States Navy in the Pacific Theater.
