Chris Fialko Re-Nominated to NC Sentencing and Policy Advisory Commission

RALEIGH, NC —

NCAJ President Bill Powers has re-nominated attorney Chris Fialko of Fialko Law PLLC in Charlotte to represent the NC Advocates for Justice (NCAJ) on the North Carolina Sentencing and Policy Advisory Commission for a third term. The Commission was created by the General Assembly in 1990 to make recommendations to the General Assembly for the modification of sentencing laws and policies, and for the addition, deletion, or expansion of sentencing options as necessary to achieve policy goals.

Chris Fialko is Board Certified by the North Carolina State Bar as a Specialist in both State and Federal Criminal Defense. He began his practice in the 1990s in Charlotte and Western North Carolina, representing people accused in State and Federal courts of everything from assault on a female to robbery, from embezzlement to drug trafficking, from burglary to murder. In the 2000s, he shifted much of his practice to “white collar” cases, concentrating on advising and representing businessmen and professionals who face federal criminal, regulatory, or licensing investigations.

NCAJ provides continuing legal education for lawyers aimed at enhancing the quality of the legal profession, offers public education programs aimed at enhancing public access and understanding of the legal system, supports the writing of amicus briefs for the appellate courts, and advocates at the legislature in the areas of criminal and civil justice.
