NC Advocates for Justice elects local attorney as President for coming year

RALEIGH -

Chris Nichols, partner at the Nichols Law Firm in Raleigh, has been elected President of the North Carolina Advocates for Justice (NCAJ), a state-wide association of attorneys and other legal professionals who protect the rights of all North Carolinians in civil and criminal cases. As President, Mr. Nichols will lead NCAJ's Executive Committee for the June 2015-June 2016 fiscal year.
