# Apple Devices

Allows communication between any Apple Device and Smart TV

- iPad
- iPhone
- Laptop (Mac Book)



# Benefits of Apple Device

- Apps for Programs for trial presentations inexpensive
  - Programs allow quick access to medical records, reports, deposition transcripts, photographs and exhibits
  - Appropriate documents can be projected to the jury as the witness is being questioned
    - Medical imaging studies
    - Important documents
    - Rules and Regs
  - No longer a need to publish photographs to jury



# Internet Access

- Testimony can be elicited from witness anywhere there is access to internet and a camera
  - Reduces cost because no video cost or transcript costs
  - Eliminates need to postpone trial because witness not available
  - Expands the scope of available expert witnesses
  - Reduces cost of producing expert in the court room and paying expert to wait
  - Eliminates time, cost and urgency in filing motion for objections at video dep
