OAJ VOTES: Vote early in person or by mail

Anyone can vote early or request ballot to vote by mail.

Although the polls will be open on November 3, you may be out of town, want to avoid lines or crowds, or if you just want to get it out of the way, you can vote early.

In Person Early Voting:

- If you have registered, you can vote early by visiting your county board of elections or other designated locations beginning 8 AM on October 6 and through 2 PM on November 2.
- Check with your BoE ([Board of Elections directory](#)) for the location of early voting centers in your county.

Vote By Mail:

- You can also vote by mail. Complete the ballot application, sent by the Secretary of State or [posted online](#), then mail it the local BoE. You can send in your ballot app now.
- Mail in ballots can and should be requested ASAP. The OAJ recommends that ballot applications should be sent no later than October 12 to provide enough time for the ballot to be mailed to the voter and successfully returned to the Board of Election. Do not delay, request a ballot today.
- Ballots for the November 3rd election will be mailed on October 6. Return the completed ballot ASAP. In the spring primary 14,100 ballots did not count because they were not mailed back in time.
- Completed ballots can be delivered in person to the Board of Elections.
- Do not delay or wait to return your ballot. However, to make sure your absentee ballot is counted, it must be received by your board of elections by 7:30 p.m. on Election Day OR be postmarked by the day before Election Day.
