

Members Helping Others: TRIAL LAWYERS CARE

CASD's Community Outreach Committee led by Brett Schreiber, formed a team to participate in The Second Annual San Diego Walk for Darfur. It was one of the largest walks for the cause in the United States with more than 1,500 participants. Participants could run, jog, or walk approximately 2 or 4 miles in San Diego's beautiful De Anza Cove in Mission Bay Park.



The purpose of the Walk for Darfur was to show solidarity for the people of Darfur, to use a collective voice to help stop the Darfur genocide and to raise funds for a humanitarian project that the American Jewish World Service is involved with in Darfur. Funds raised were for the purpose of supporting several projects in Internally Displaced Camps in Darfur that work with women and children, all victims of trauma, in a variety of educational, psychological and social programs.

The event raised over \$56,000.00 to continue providing psychosocial services to children and victims of violence in west Darfur refugee camps. The entire cost of the event was underwritten by corporate sponsorship, so every penny raised went directly to helping those in need in the Darfur camps.



CASD's Community Outreach Committee formed a team for the Walk — "Trial Lawyers Care". The Trial Lawyers Care team, comprised of 22 CASD members and their families, raised over \$1,400 to support the cause.

Team Captain, CASD Board member Brett Schreiber, said, "We had a great turn-out, and the outpouring of support by the entire CASD community was wonderful! As our team walked around the Bay, many fellow participants were heard to say: 'Way to go trial lawyers!' That's something you don't hear every day. We'll definitely be back next year!"
