

TULSA COUNTY BAR FOUNDATION LAW SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

The Tulsa County Bar Foundation is authorized to fund law school scholarships of up to \$2,500 per individual per year. The scholarships are intended for the benefit of law students in or from Tulsa County who are accepted to an ABA-accredited law school. The scholarships are offered and administered without discrimination based on race, ethnicity, religion, national origin, gender or disability.

While the scholarships are intended for the benefit of law students from Tulsa County, the Foundation recognizes that a student from Tulsa County may attend a law school outside Tulsa County and that students from other locations may attend law school in Tulsa County. The test for eligibility for consideration for a Foundation scholarship is therefore whether the student has “a significant connection” to Tulsa County in the judgment of the Foundation’s Scholarship Committee.

An award made to a first-year student may be renewed in each of the following years in law school. The total funding offered to any student shall not exceed three times the amount of his or her first scholarship, and the distribution of such funding shall be over a time period not exceeding four years. Although each recipient will need to re-apply for the scholarship each year, the expectation is that the scholarship will be renewed each year if satisfactory academic performance has been achieved, the student is otherwise eligible, and funding is available.

In selecting scholarship recipients, the Foundation will consider the applicant’s connection with Tulsa County; financial need; academic record; extra-curricular record and record of leadership and initiative; commitment to the study and practice or teaching of law; character; and work and life experience. Financial information for the applicant’s household and that of the applicant’s parents is necessary to evaluate financial need. Recipients will be selected by members of the Scholarship Committee of the Foundation. The decisions of the Committee are final.

Requirements for Eligibility

To be eligible to receive a Foundation scholarship, an applicant must meet all the following requirements:

1. The applicant must be an entering first-year law student in the 2021 academic year. Students who have completed one or more semesters of law school are not eligible. Applicants who are part-time law students also must be starting law school in the 2021 academic year to be eligible.
2. At the time of submission of the application, the applicant must have achieved undergraduate grades in the top 50% of the applicant’s college undergraduate class and have LSAT scores in the top 50% of the LSAT testing pool.
3. The applicant must be a citizen of the United States and *have a significant connection to Tulsa County*. In determining this factor, the Scholarship Committee will weigh past or current residency in Tulsa County, attendance at Tulsa County schools, intention to attend law school in Tulsa County, significant business or family connections in Tulsa County, or some combination of the above.
4. Immediate family members of any member of the Board of the Foundation (including executive director) or of the Scholarship Committee are not eligible to receive a scholarship.

Before receiving scholarship funds, recipients will be required to demonstrate admission to and plans to enroll in an ABA-accredited law school. Students who leave law school after accepting scholarship funds will be required to return all or a proportional amount of scholarship funds received during that academic year.

To apply for a Foundation scholarship, please provide the following information:

1. **Application Form.** Each applicant must complete the attached application form. Parents' financial information is required for every scholarship applicant regardless of the student's age, marital status, length of self-emancipation or family responsibilities. If special circumstances exist which prevent you from providing financial information for your parents, please explain those circumstances in a separate statement. If your parents are separated or divorced, please submit information from both biological parents. Parents may complete separate applications, and all information will be kept confidential.

To complete the application, you must attach copies of federal income tax forms for yourself and your parents. If you have completed your 2020 federal income tax return, please attach a copy to your application. If you have not yet completed your 2020 return, you may submit copies of your 2019 tax return. Please indicate in the appropriate section of the application if you or your parents are not required to complete federal income tax returns. Each applicant is responsible for notifying the Foundation in writing of any changes that may have an effect on his or her financial status.

2. **Personal Statement.** Your personal statement is your opportunity to include information that the application form does not convey and that you feel will assist us in reaching a thoughtful decision on your application. Your personal statement must begin with a paragraph establishing your eligibility for consideration for a Foundation scholarship by addressing each of the three "Requirements for Eligibility" set forth on the preceding page. You may also include information about your personal strengths, special or unusual circumstances that may have affected your academic performance, or educational progression; personal or family history of socio-economic disadvantage; reasons for your interest in a law-related career; and any other information you believe will assist the Committee in its consideration. Your personal statement should be typewritten and limited to 1000 words.
3. **Recommendations.** Each applicant must submit two letters of recommendation, at least one of which should be from a professor. If you have been out of school for a number of years and have difficulty finding an academic recommendation, please substitute letters from employers or others who have worked closely with you. No more than four recommendations will be considered. Recommendation letters are particularly useful when the writer provides substantive, comparative information about the applicant's abilities, activities and personal qualities, including specific examples that illustrate these attributes.
4. **Transcript.** Each applicant must submit a copy of his or her undergraduate transcript. If you are selected to receive a scholarship, you will be required to submit an official copy of the transcript before receiving scholarship funds.
5. **Interview.** The Committee reserves the right to interview an applicant in person or by telephone as part of the deliberative process.
