



Cameron Jehl Named President of the Tennessee Trial Lawyers Association

Nashville — The Tennessee Trial Lawyers Association recently elected Cameron Jehl as president for the 2018-19 term. Jehl, a Memphis attorney, replaces Bruce Fox of Clinton who served as president from 2017-18. Fox now assumes the role of immediate past president and Matt Hardin of Nashville advances to president-elect.

In 2013, Mr. Jehl went on to open the Jehl Law Group, PLLC where he has continued to fight to protect the rights of the elderly. He is licensed to practice law in Arkansas, Illinois, Kentucky, Mississippi, Missouri, Pennsylvania and Tennessee.
