



LGBTQ BAR PREPARATION SCHOLARSHIP

The mission of the Washington State Association for Justice (WSAJ) is to stand up in the courtroom and the halls of government for real people. We defend your Constitutional rights, including the right to have your day in court. We hold corporate and other powerful interests accountable. We are a community creating and sharing resources for our members to secure justice.

In December of 2016, WSAJ created its LGBTQ section, a group open to all WSAJ members to focus on LGBTQ issues in the law, as well as to provide a safe, open and honest environment for LGBTQ members to discuss and confront issues that arise in their day-to-day practices and legal communities. WSAJ's LGBTQ section is modeled after the national-level LGBT Caucus of the American Association for Justice, and provides an opportunity for all members to work together against hate and intolerance, and to increase awareness and understanding of the issues faced by LGBTQ individuals in the profession.

To support aspiring plaintiff's attorneys from the LGBTQ community, the section raises funds from its membership to provide scholarships to help defray the costs of a Themis bar review course to law school graduates and APR 6 law clerk graduates who identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, or otherwise self-identify as a part of the queer community. Scholarship recipients will be selected based on several criteria, including (but not limited to) demonstrated interest and intent to practice in the plaintiff's bar, financial need, academic achievements, extracurricular and community activities, and life experiences. No single criterion is determinative.

If a selected applicant has already enrolled in a Themis course, they will be reimbursed up to \$1,395. **Applicants must self-identify as LGBTQ and must be preparing to take the Washington State bar exam in the next year.**

Applications are due by **Friday, November 17, 2017**. All applicants will receive email notification from WSAJ of award or non-award by **Friday, December 15, 2017**. Additional application instructions can be found at the end of this form.
