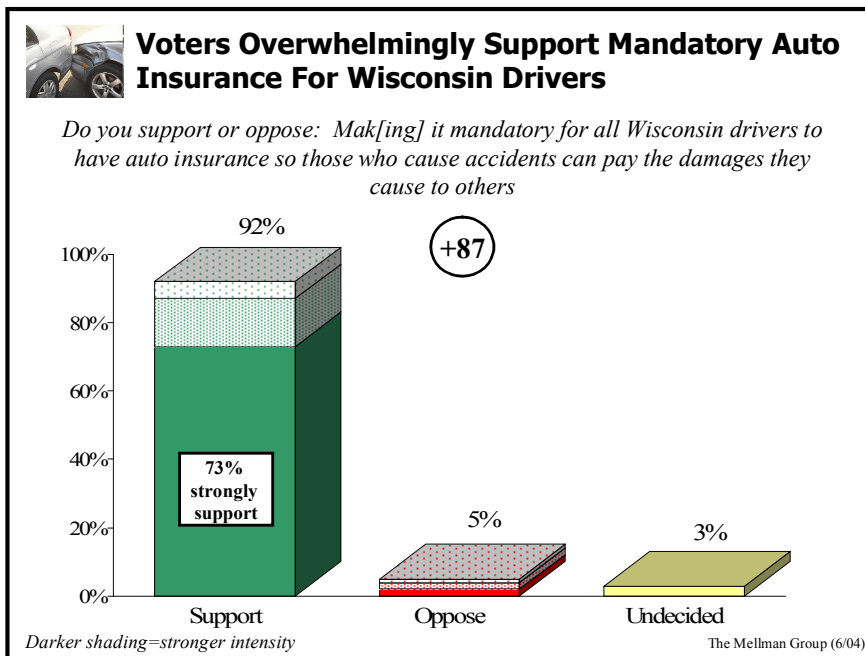

**Re:** Mandatory Auto Insurance In Wisconsin

The Mellman Group conducted a statewide survey of 500 likely voters in Wisconsin. The poll was conducted by telephone January 21-25, 2009, and used a voter-file based sample of all registered voters in the state. The margin of error for this survey is +/-4.4% at the 95% level of confidence. The margin of error is larger for subgroups



Wisconsin voters overwhelmingly support a proposal to require all drivers in the state to have auto insurance. Ninety-two percent (92%) support mandatory auto insurance, while only 5% oppose the idea. Moreover, nearly three-quarters (73%) strongly support requiring Wisconsin drivers to have auto insurance.

Support for this proposal crosses demographic groups and party lines, with Republicans (93% support, 6% oppose) joining both Democrats (92% support, 5% oppose) and independents (91% support, 5% oppose) in nearly unanimous support for the proposal.

Indeed, overwhelming majorities in every demographic group and region of the state support this requirement.
