The Majesty of God

How can the Almighty God describe Himself in ways that mortals could ever begin to comprehend Him? The vastness of our universe revealed to us by those telescopes created in recent years have just begun to magnify His power. How many galaxies are there which have been discovered? How many stars are there in each of those galaxies? Think about this, and then imagine the greatness of God who created each of them and all there is in them in just six days. How many times does Genesis say that He spoke and it was done?

When Solomon described God's presence in the temple he was dedicating, he magnified God by saying, "Behold, heaven and the heaven of heavens cannot contain You. How much less this temple which I have built" (1 Kgs. 8:27)? God is great. God is good. He is infinite in all of His ways, but we are finite in all of ours!

God is a spirit (<u>John 4:24</u>). After His resurrection Jesus said, "Behold My hands and My feet, that it is I Myself. Handle Me and see, for a spirit does not have flesh and bones as you see I have" (<u>Luke 24:39</u>). How do you describe a spirit? How do you describe your soul, your spirit? How do you describe God?

God gives us words connected with our mortal bodies to help us understand Him. We can grasp these words, but they do not even begin to touch the hem of the garments to reveal Jehovah. God uses language we can grasp to try to give us insight into what He is like by using words we know. Think about this as you read the rest of this article.

The Bible speaks of God's eyes. Does God see? He sees that which we could never see. He saw the thoughts and the intents of the heart of every man on this earth before the flood (Gen. 6:5). "All things are naked and open to the eyes of Him to whom we must give account" (Heb. 4:13). He has eyes but not like ours.

The Bible speaks of God's ears. Does God hear? He hears every word every man speaks (Matt. 12:36). Peter speaks of God and righteous men and says, "His ears are open to their prayers (1 Pet. 3:12). He has ears but not like ours.

The Bible speaks of God's face. Peter also says, "The face of the Lord is against those that do evil" (1 Pet. 3:12). He has a face but not like ours.

The Bible speaks of God having many other parts of a body. Space does not permit us to discuss His hands, His arms, His feet, His mouth and much more. God uses the finite things we know to help us begin to understand the infinite. No man has seen Him in all His immeasurable majesty at any time (John 1:18). Aren't you glad that God has revealed unknowable things in knowable ways that even a child can understand?

Not Sure If You Like Prunes, But God Does

In God's eyes, there are only two kinds of disciples—and He only approves of one of them. In John 15, Jesus portrays the church as a vineyard, where He is the vine, the Father is the vinedresser and each individual Christian is a branch. He depicts two kinds of branches—those who bear fruit and those who do not bear fruit. Which kind of branch are you?

Jesus makes it clear that branches (i.e., disciples/Christians) that do not bear fruit are taken away, cast out, gathered, thrown into the fire and burned (John 15:2, 6). The directness and decisiveness with which Jesus describes this is rather intense. But, then there are those branches that do bear fruit. Notice in verse two what God does to the fruit-bearing Christians and why He does it.

"Every branch that bears fruit He prunes." What does that mean? To "prune" means to clean, cleanse, purge, purify. The verb is used in the present tense to emphasize the continual nature of God's cleansing the fruit-bearing Christian—cleansing him from the impurities and guilt of sin.

How exactly does God prune? Verse three tells us—"You are already clean because of the word which I have spoken to you." The Word of God is living, active and powerful (cf. <u>Heb. 4:12</u>). His words are not idle print on pieces of paper. God's word changes lives—it teaches, corrects, disciplines, trains (cf. <u>2</u> <u>Tim. 3:16</u>). In this way, it prunes those who diligently give themselves to its reading, study and meditation.

So, what's the purpose? Why does God continue to prune/clean/purify those disciples who bear fruit? Again, we don't have to go far

to find the answer. Read <u>John</u> <u>15:2</u> again. "Every branch that bears fruit He prunes, **that it may bear more fruit**."

Do you know why God cleansed you and continues to purge you from your sin and uncleanness? So that you can bear as much fruit as possible! A faithful, diligent fruit-bearer is never satisfied with how much he/she has done for the Lord. A faithful, diligent fruit-bearer—rather than looking for opportunities to take a break or quit—is always active, working and searching for ways to be useful in the kingdom of God.

Why does he/she want to bear more fruit? He who bears fruit is pruned by the Word. He is pruned to bear more fruit. He bears more fruit and continues to be pruned by the Word. He is continually pruned by the Lord and His Word in order that he might bear more and more fruit. (See the cycle?)

How much fruit do you bear for Him and how much more do you long to bear? Get into His word! Let it prune you! Then, find souls around you who need what you have!
