THE DEATH OF JESUS

The death of Jesus occurred according to God’s appointed schedule. Christ says, “The hour has come for the Son of man to be glorified” (John 12:23; cf. John 13:1; 13:32; 17:1, etc.). “In the fullness of time, God sent forth His Son...” (Gal.4:4).

The death of Jesus brings fruit to God. “Except a grain of wheat falls into the ground and dies, it remains by itself alone, but if it dies, it bears much fruit” (John 12:24). “We are joined to Him who was raised from the dead that we might bring forth fruit unto God” (Romans 7:4).

The death of Jesus requires deep commitment from his disciples. “He who loves his life loses it; he that hates his life in this world shall keep it to life eternal” (John 12:25,26).

The death of Jesus involved intense suffering. “My soul has become troubled...but for this purpose I came to this hour” (John 12:27).

The death of Jesus brings glory to the Father. “Father, glorify thy name. There came a voice out of heaven: ‘I have both glorified it and will glorify it again’” (John 12:28).

The death of Jesus, in combination with His resurrection, defeated Satan. “Now judgment is upon the world; now the prince of this world shall be cast out” (John 12:31).

The death of Jesus meant He would be lifted up on the cross. “And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of man be lifted up” (John 3:14). “When you have lifted up the Son of man, then shall you know that I am he, and that I do nothing of myself, but as the Father taught me, I speak these things” (John 8:28).

The death of Jesus is the drawing power of God. “And I, if I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all men unto myself” (John 12:32). DB
