

WHEN THE EARTH OPENED ITS MOUTH

Wednesday evening in the adult class, we looked at the rebellion of Korah, Dathan and Abiram (Numbers 16). The lessons for us are numerous. Notice a few.

Refusing to submit to God is always sinful, even if you have others willing to do the same. Korah brought 250 well-known, respected men with him as he challenged Moses (Num.16:1-3). If one person or a hundred people support an action contrary to God’s will, it is still wrong. (cf.Matthew 7:13-14; John 7:48).

Rebellion and a distorted mind are always connected. Dathan and Abiram claimed Egypt had been a pleasant experience, when it had actually been a time of hard, rigorous labor and ruthless treatment (Exodus 1:13,14). They also blamed Moses for the wilderness wandering predicaments, when, actually, it was the spies unfaithful report which caused the suffering (Num.14:31-35). “Vain imaginations” and “darkened hearts” still keep people away from the Lord (Rom.1:21-22).

The Lord knows those who belong to Him (2 Tim.2:19). He separated Moses, Aaron and the rest of the congregation away from the evil men and their families (Num.16:16-30). He brought swift and certain judgment to these men by doing a new thing – opening up the earth and swallowing them up (Num.16:31-35).

The proper way to respond to rebellion is twofold. First, humble prayer. Moses “fell on his face” (Num.16:4) and pleaded for them to repent. Instead of hasty and emotional reactions, we would wise to follow this example. Second, Moses tried to reason with Korah, reminding him that “it is no small thing” to be able to serve as they had been doing for the Lord (Num.16:8-9). Let us never lose sight of how great God is and how eternally important it is to worship and serve Him faithfully (cf.I Peter 2:5). (Please look for an accompanying outline on the tables).
