FAMILY IMPACT

There is a principle about family and church which must be underscored. The principle is this – strong Biblical families build strong churches. In discussing leadership, Paul states, "If someone does not know how to take care of his own household, how will he take care of the church of God" (I Tim.3:5)? In other words, let the Lord build the home (Psalm 127:1-2) and the Lord will build the church (I Cor.3:5-7).

What, then, is God's strategy for bringing children and youth to the Lord? "Bring them up in the instruction and discipline of the Lord" (Ephesians 6:4). His strategy obviously is for youth to be impacted by "the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God" (Ephesians 6:17). Now, who, yes, who does God want to teach the children? Look carefully to the word of God and note "fathers" (Eph.6:4) and "parents" (Eph.6:1). And, note that the older women are to train the younger women to love their husbands and to love their children (Titus 2:4). The "what" and the "who" is crucial; scripture says be careful here lest we "blaspheme the word of God" (Titus 2:5).

W.T. Allison, gospel preacher of last generation, would often come to Faulkner University, and tell the Bible students there, that the order of God is to teach the parents so they can teach their children.

BAPTISMS

There are several different types of "baptisms" in the New Testament.

- The Holy Spirit baptism (Acts 1:5), promised only to the apostles and the household of Cornelius (Acts 10:44-48; Acts 11:15,16) in order to reveal and confirm the truth (John 16:13; Mark 16:20). This baptism is not available today because "all truth" has been revealed and confirmed (John 16:13).
- The baptism of suffering. This refers to the suffering Christ endured on the cross and the subsequent suffering the apostles would receive on His behalf (Mark 10:35ff).
- The baptism of fire refers to the eventual punishment of hell awaiting the rebellious and unfaithful (Matt.3:10-12).
- John's baptism was for the remission of sins in anticipation of and faith in the One coming after him (Acts 19:4).
- Today, there is only "one baptism" (Eph.4:5). The sinner who has never obeyed Christ is commanded to be immersed for the forgiveness of sins (Acts 2:38; I Peter 3:21), predicated on his penitent faith (Mark 16:16). This submission to God's will begins the relationship with Christ (Gal.3:27) and adds one to the Lord's church (Acts 2:41). May we faithfully teach the good news to as many as possible.

Pursue Righteousness

Numerous times in Scripture the Lord encourages us to "pursue righteousness." The term righteousness is variously used, sometimes referring to virtuous or obedient living and other times referring to the condition of being made innocent by God and thus acceptable to Him.

The idea is this: The Lord expects us to live a life of obedience and virtue. Additionally, in His grace and mercy, the Lord offers us the only hope we have to be declared innocent. Thus, in a sense, to pursue righteousness is to pursue a life with God now and to dwell in His presence forever!

"The way of the wicked is an abomination to the Lord, but He loves him who pursues righteousness" (Prov. 15:9).

"Whoever pursues righteousness and kindness will find life, righteousness, and honor" (Prov. 21:21).

"Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied" (Matt. 5:6). **Bart Warren**


BLESSINGS FROM MEN'S DAY
