

BEHOLD THE PATTERN

Scriptures clearly teach that the teachings of Jesus are a pattern for our lives today. The apostle Paul writes, "Follow the pattern of the sound words that you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus" (2 Timothy 1:13). Romans 6:17 says, "You have obeyed from the heart that pattern of teaching which was delivered to you."

Behold the pattern for acceptable worship. Looking at Philippians 3:3, we read, "who worship by the Spirit of God and glory in Christ Jesus and put no confidence in the flesh." Worshipping by the Spirit is worshipping by His instruction. "The sword of the Spirit is the word of God" (Eph.6:17). This statement is similar to Jesus' words, "God is spirit and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and in truth" (John 4:24). In praying for his disciples, Jesus identifies the truth as the word of God (John 17:17). And, note this curious expression of Paul, "For God is my witness, whom I serve with my spirit in the gospel of His Son" (Romans 1:9). God's word (the New Testament) directs us in what to do in worship and the spirit which must be involved in it. "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God" (Colossians 3:16).

Behold the pattern of obtaining salvation. The Lord's great commission charges one "to make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them into the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit" (Matt.28:19). Mark records the charge like this, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature; he who believes and is baptized shall be saved; he that does not believe will be condemned" (16:15,16). Luke's account reads, "that the Christ should suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that repentance and remission sins should be preached in his name beginning at Jerusalem" (24:46,47). The pattern for obtaining salvation includes belief in Christ, the Son of God, repenting of or turning from sin, confessing one's faith (Rom.10:9-10), and being immersed for forgiveness of sin. The book of Acts shows Jesus' disciples faithfully proclaiming the same conditions for salvation laid out by our Lord (Acts 2:36-38; Acts 8:26-40; etc.).

Further reading of the New Testament reveals patterns for Christian living, the home and good mental health (2 Peter 1:5-11; Luke 2:52; Phil.4:6-9).

Behold the pattern.

In giving his life for us, Jesus took our place (the wages of sin is death, Romans 6:23). In shedding his blood for us, Jesus provided for our cleansing from sin (Rev.7:13,14). In being resurrected from the dead, Jesus gives us assurance of forgiveness and hope for eternal life (Romans 4:25). "Be ye thankful" (Col.3:15).
