Course Description and Content

This Internship course will grant academic credit in lieu of MFA Professional Practices class that is not offered this semester. The Professional Internship course is for students who have an internship over the course of the semester working in an approved art or art-related field.

- form professional connections in the arts
- professional networking experiences

Course Structure

The intern will work up to 10 hours per week, documenting experiences through a written journal, photolog, and end of semester self assessment. These will be due on reading day along with an evaluation by the internship supervisor.

Daily record of all internship activities with special note on any where you are gaining new knowledge. (1 point. 10% of semester grade. Due by Reading Day.

Photo-log:

Portfolio of photos documenting each major internship project/activity you worked on.

End of Semester Reflective Summary:

Summary of the activities, learning, and other benefits of the internship. 200-300 words.

(4 points. 40% of semester grade. Due by Reading Day.)

Assessment of the student by the Internship Supervisor.
