Guidelines and Policies:

Purpose: The Recitation is intended to provide time for additional help, cover additional material, and cover topics not as easily addressed in lecture.

Grading: Your Recitation grade covers 10% of course grade. ‘Showing up’ does NOT constitute “Attendance”. Attendance requires active participation and will be measured in different ways depending on the goal of the Recitation. At a minimum, to receive credit for attendance you must arrive to the Recitation by the start time and work the entirety of the class period. Each Recitation will be worth 10 total points. Doing what is expected of you as explained in Recitation will typically be sufficient to earn the points. You will lose points for being disruptive, being late or leaving before released. The grades in all but your lowest two Recitation meetings will be calculated into your grade.

Classroom Expectations: Students are expected to behave appropriately while in the classroom.
