Purpose

This UGMT course is a continuation of the associated lecture course: Math 1100.770, extending the 3 hour algebra course to be 6 hours. This allows for review and support content along with the content of the Math 1100 content.

Course Prerequisites or Other Restrictions

This course is only for students who are TSI incomplete in math. Students enrolled in UGMT 1300.771 must also be enrolled in Math 1100.770.

Course Grades

Grading

This course is graded Pass/No Pass (P/NP). A grade of Pass (P) will be assigned to students who score 60% or more in the accompanying lecture course (Math 1100.770). A grade of No Pass (NP) will be assigned to students who score less than 70% in the lecture course (Math 1100.770). Students with a grade of Pass (P) in this course will fulfill their TSI requirement for math.

Additional Course Policies

Attendance Policy

Class attendance is mandatory and is part of the grade. Please refer to the Math 1100.770 syllabus regarding the absence policy for the course.

Students are responsible for all information given in class, regardless of their attendance. You are expected to attend class, take notes, and actively participate in class. If you are absent, then it is your responsibility to find out what information was given during class and to get a copy of the notes from a classmate.
