

Course Grading

Assignments-600 points

You will have a weekly assignment due each FRIDAY via Canvas. The Assignments or "Challenges" will each have their own module with resources and instructions. Each Assignment is worth 50 points.

Quizzes-150 points

There is a series of "How would you..." Quizzes. These Quizzes ask you to describe how you would solve a problem in a step by step order of operations. Most of the time as a property manager you will be asked to make things that do not exists and also won't be broken by an actor. So basically, how would you tackle the impossible. You will be allowed to of coarse to research and ask the internet etc to come up with your answer(s). Each quiz is worth 25 points

Discussions-150 points

There will be two discussion threads where you will start a thread about the assigned subject and then have to comment on two other's student's research. Each discussion is worth 75 points.

Portfolio- 100 points

If you have ever taken a class with me you know the routine.... Document your work throughout the semester to create a digital portfolio of your work. (If you are building a website for another one of my classes you can just create different page(s).)

Grading

- A: 90-100% (Outstanding, excellent work. The student performs well above the minimum criteria.)
- B: 80-89% (Good, impressive work. The student performs above the minimum criteria.)
- C: 70-79% (Solid, college-level work. The student meets the criteria of the assignment.)
- D: 60-69% (Below average work. The student fails to meet the minimum criteria.)
- F: 59 and below (Sub-par work. The student fails to complete the assignment.)

Grade-related Policies

Late Work
