Course Description

We will discuss material related to the following topics as time permits:

Ordinary differential equations arising from partial differential equations by means of separation of variables; method of characteristics for first-order PDEs; boundary value problems for ODEs; comparative study of heat equation, wave equation and Laplace's equation by separation of variables and numerical methods; further topics in numerical solution of ODEs.

Course Objectives

The aim of the course is to develop a practical understanding of basic aspects of Partial Differential Equations. The course is designed to introduce students to be able to derive the classical partial differential equations in mathematical physics, understand the various possible initial and boundary value problems you can pose for these equations, and be able to solve them in special cases. You should also get a basic understanding of Fourier series.
