**Course Content:** Solo vocal literature in Europe to 1750. The development of the *Lied* from 1750 to the present.

#### Unit Projects: [2 @ 10 points each]

Fifteen to twenty minute in-class presentations, each on an art song (or other solo vocal) topic. Audio or video examples should be included. Supplemental materials should be submitted online through Canvas. (Students may opt to write a traditional five to ten-page paper in lieu of either or both presentations.)

### **Semester Project [25 points]**

Fifty minute in-class presentation, on a topic appropriate to the semester (i.e. Pre-1750 or the Lied.) Audio or video examples should be included. Supplemental materials should be submitted online through Canvas. (Students may opt to write a traditional ten to twenty-page paper in lieu of this presentation.)

## Unit Tests [3 @ 10 points each]

Online exam including matching, multiple choice, short answer, score identification, and/or essay.

#### Final Exam [20 points]

Comprehensive exam including matching, multiple choice, short answer, score identification, and/or essay.

#### NATS Assignment [5 points]

Submit a "reaction paper" for ONE Artist Series program from the Texoma NATS Conference held at UNT on November 2 or 3.
