Focus of the Special Problems

This course explores modernism and art history in relation to Indonesia and Indonesian scholarship. The student will develop a bibliography, write a historiography, develop a research agenda, and research a related question or problem with the aim of developing a research paper for presention during spring 2026 Scholars Day at UNT.

STRUCTURE

It is the responsibility of the student to contact the professor to schedule meetings, to meet as scheduled, and to submit work as indicated in this syllabus.

Deadlines for assignments along with their worth on a scale of 100 points will be determined in conversation during the first week of the semester.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES AND ASSIGNMENTS

 develop a bibliography of the most recent scholarly writing about Indonesian modern art and art history using relevant databases, websites, and museum collections

- using the bibliography, write a historiography for a selected area of research in Indonesian modern art and art history
- create a research question and agenda from the historiography
- apply art history methods to research the question
- develop and edit drafts of the paper in process once completed
- present an portion of the paper at UNT Scholars Day during spring 2026
- develop an abstract related to the research project and submit to a conference for undergraduate art history
