Description*: Fibers, fabric, construction, and finishes applied to the selection, use, and care of home furnishings fabrics. **Prerequisite:** none.

Objectives:

- To develop an understanding of the fibers and fabrics used within the furnishings industry for both residential and commercial interiors.
- To become aware of the construction techniques and finishes used for residential and commercial furnishings.
- To learn how to specify fabrics for residential and commercial interiors.
- To develop an understanding of how to use and care for textile home furnishings.
