Office Hours by Appointment

1. Lessons begin August 30, with 13 lessons in the term including Thanksgiving week. Fall juries begin on November 29, with Performance Major juries on Monday/Concentration and Secondaries scheduled later in the week depending on space availability.
2. Weekly attendance is required, with excused absence only for illness or by pre-arrangement with Dr. Clardy. Rescheduling of lessons due to illness requires at least a 3-hour notice in case of sudden illness.
3. Masks are expected to be worn at all times in the studio to insure health and safety for yourself, studio mates, associates, Professor Clardy and all members of the campus community. Flute masks are on order and will be distributed as soon as received.
4. Studio Class meets on Fridays/4 PM in the Choir Room, with one performance required by each student during the semester, either individual or chamber performance.
5. Lessons will be recorded, with each individual student responsible for recording the lesson and submitting for review in the lesson. A composite sound file of semester lessons will be submitted by the end of the semester and will be included as a portion of the student's final semester grade.

 - 4th year/MM/DMA – MK Clardy Etudes Book II (ED 30015)Orchestral Excerpts as assigned, with complete parts required for study and available for download from ISLP.
 - Suggested chamber music study from Classic Duets for flute (UE 70 005), Kuhlau Duets Op. 10
